This is the first call for reservations for the 92nd CEMA Engineering Conference which will meet at the LaPlaya Beach Hotel, Naples, Florida, June 23 - June 26, 2019.

Enclosed is a Registration form and a Tentative Program. The form can be filled out electronically and returned by email (File, Save, Close, Forward with attachment). Confirmation of receipt of your registration will be sent within 48 hours. **Each representative needs to complete a registration form.**

The cut-off date for hotel reservations is May 17, 2019. **CEMA will make your hotel reservation.** Please note that you must **cancel hotel reservations seven (7) days prior** to your arrival date to avoid a one night room charge! Your hotel room must be guaranteed to a major credit card.

If you would like to **guarantee a Gulf View room**, the upgrade charges have been revised by La Playa. See below:

These charges are additional to the group rate of \$194 plus tax per night. Otherwise, you can put in a request and take your chances at Check-In.

IN ORDER FOR SPOUSES/GUESTS/CHILDREN TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MEAL EVENTS, THEY MUST BE REGISTERED.

Instead of a speaker on Monday morning, the schedule has been rearranged to allow more time for the participants to work on technical, mechanical, and standardization issues affecting the industry. All attendees will be provided a Certificate of Attendance, along with the topics worked on, that they can submit for educational credit to their certifying organizations as proof of continuing professional education.

The hotel room rate is \$194.00 per night for single or double occupancy. Any additional person above two people is \$30 per person per night. Children under 16 years of age are complimentary in the guest room. The resort fee of \$32 per room per night has been waived for us again this year. Included are: wired high speed internet in guest rooms, wireless high speed Internet at pool, beach, and restaurants, local calls, 800 long distance calls, information calls, newspapers, coffee, use of beach chairs, beach towels, beach umbrellas, beach services and access to the fitness center. The current taxes are 7% Florida State Sales tax and 5% County tax. We have a special rate of \$10 per day for overnight parking.

The registration fees will be as follows: Early Registration by May 3 - \$775 for the first company representative and \$725 for additional company representatives. Registrations received **after** May 3 - \$875 for the first company representative and \$825 for additional company representatives. The fee for spouses and significant others will be \$450. There is no charge for children under 12 at the buffets. For the plated dinner, the charge is \$60 per child. For children 12 - 18 years old, the fee is \$400 per child.

ANTITRUST POLICY STATEMENT OF THE CONVEYOR EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURERS ASSOCIATION

GENERAL RULES OF ANTITRUST COMPLIANCE

(Revised by the CEMA Board of Directors March 5, 2005)

The Conveyor Equipment Manufacturers Association is a trade association of members of the conveyor manufacturing industry which was incorporated in 1935 under the non-profit corporation law of the State of Illinois. It is organized to promote the common interests of its members and of the members of the conveyor manufacturing industry, when such interests do not conflict with the common good. CEMA is not intended to become involved, and will not become involved, in the competitive business decisions of its member companies, nor will it take any action which would tend to restrain competition in the conveyor manufacturing industry.

Nevertheless, it is recognized by the Board of Directors of CEMA that the Association and its varied activities could be regarded by some as a forum or opportunity to promote anticompetitive conduct. For this reason, the Board of Directors has taken this occasion, through this statement of policy, to make clear its unequivocal support for the policy of competition served by the antitrust laws as well as its uncompromising intent to comply strictly in all respects with those laws. In addition to the Association's firm commitment to the principle of competition served by the antitrust laws, the penalties which may be imposed upon both the Association and its individual and corporate members involved in any violation of such laws, are now so severe that good business judgment demands that every effort be made to avoid any such violation. Certain violations of the Sherman Act, such as price-fixing, are felony crimes for which individuals may now be imprisoned for up to three (3) years or fined up to \$350,000 or both, and corporations can be fined up to \$10,000,000 for each offense. In addition, treble damage claims by private parties (including class actions) for antitrust violations are extremely expensive to litigate and can result in judgments of a magnitude which could destroy the Association and seriously affect the financial interests of its individual members.

It shall be the responsibility of every member of CEMA to be guided by CEMA's policy of strict compliance with the antitrust laws in all CEMA activities. It shall be the special responsibility of Association officers, committee chairs and officers of product sections and conferences to ensure that this policy is known and adhered to in the course of activities pursued under their leadership.

To assist the CEMA staff and all its officers, directors, committee chairs and conference officers in recognizing situations which may raise the appearance of an antitrust problem, the Board will, as a matter of policy, furnish to each of such persons copies of the Association's General Rules of Antitrust Compliance. The Association will also make available general legal advice when questions arise as to the manner in which the antitrust laws may apply to the activities of CEMA or to any committee or product section or conference thereof.

Antitrust compliance is the responsibility of every CEMA member. Any violation of the CEMA General Rules of Antitrust Compliance or of this general policy will result in immediate suspension from membership in the Association, and immediate removal from any Association office held by an official representative violating the same.

The following rules are applicable to all CEMA activities and must be observed in all situations and under all circumstances, without exception or qualification other than as noted below.

1. Neither CEMA nor any committee, product section, conference or activity of CEMA shall be used for the purpose of bringing about, or attempting to bring about, any understanding or agreement, written or oral, formal or informal, express or implied, among competitors with regard to prices, terms or conditions of sale, discounts, distribution, volume of production, territories or customers.
2. No CEMA activity or communication shall include discussion or action, for any purpose or in any fashion, of prices or pricing methods, production quotas or other limitations on either the timing or volume of production or of sales, or involve allocation of territories or markets of customers in any way.
3. No CEMA committee or product section or conference shall undertake any activity which involves exchange or collection and dissemination among competitors, of any information regarding prices, pricing methods, costs of production, or of labor or sales or distribution or individual company statistics of any kind, without first obtaining the advice of legal counsel, provided by the Association, as to those proper and lawful methods by which these activities may be pursued.
4. No CEMA activity or communication shall include any discussion or action which might be construed as an attempt to prevent any person or business entity from gaining access to any market or to any customer for goods or services, or to prevent or boycott any business entity from obtaining a supply of goods or otherwise purchasing goods or services freely in the market.
5. No CEMA activity or communication shall include any discussion or action which might be construed as an agreement or understanding to refrain from purchasing any raw materials, equipment, services or other supplies from any supplier.
6. Neither CEMA, nor any committee or product section or conference thereof, shall make any effort to bring about the standardization of any product or method of manufacture or certification of any product or program, for the purpose of preventing the manufacture or sale of any product not conforming to a specified standard or which would tend to have the overall effect of either lessening competition or resulting in a degree of price stabilization.
7. No person or company shall be unreasonably excluded from CEMA membership or participation in any CEMA activity, committee, product section or conference, where such exclusion may impair such person's or company's ability to compete effectively in the conveyor manufacturing industry.
8. In conducting CEMA committee meetings, or product sections or conferences, the chair thereof shall prepare and follow a formal agenda. Minutes of each meeting shall be distributed to all persons who attended such meetings. Approval of the minutes shall be obtained from the membership of the committee, section, or conference at its next meeting. Copies of the minutes shall be transmitted to the headquarters staff and to legal counsel.
9. Association speakers and authors of conference papers shall be informed of the need to comply with the Association's antitrust policy in the preparation and presentation of their papers.
10. In informal or social discussions at the site of a CEMA meeting, which are beyond the control of its officers and chairs, all representatives are expected to observe the same standards of personal conduct required of the Association in its compliance with these antitrust guidelines. In addition, copies of the foregoing Antitrust Policy Statement and General Rules of Antitrust Compliance will be included in meeting registration packets and will also be printed in CEMA Yearbooks.
