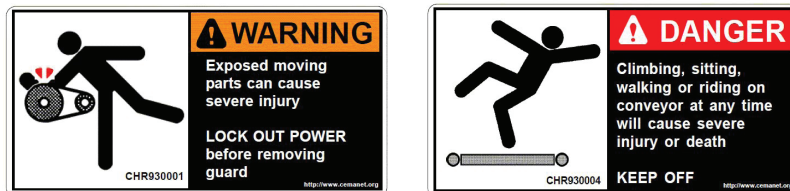

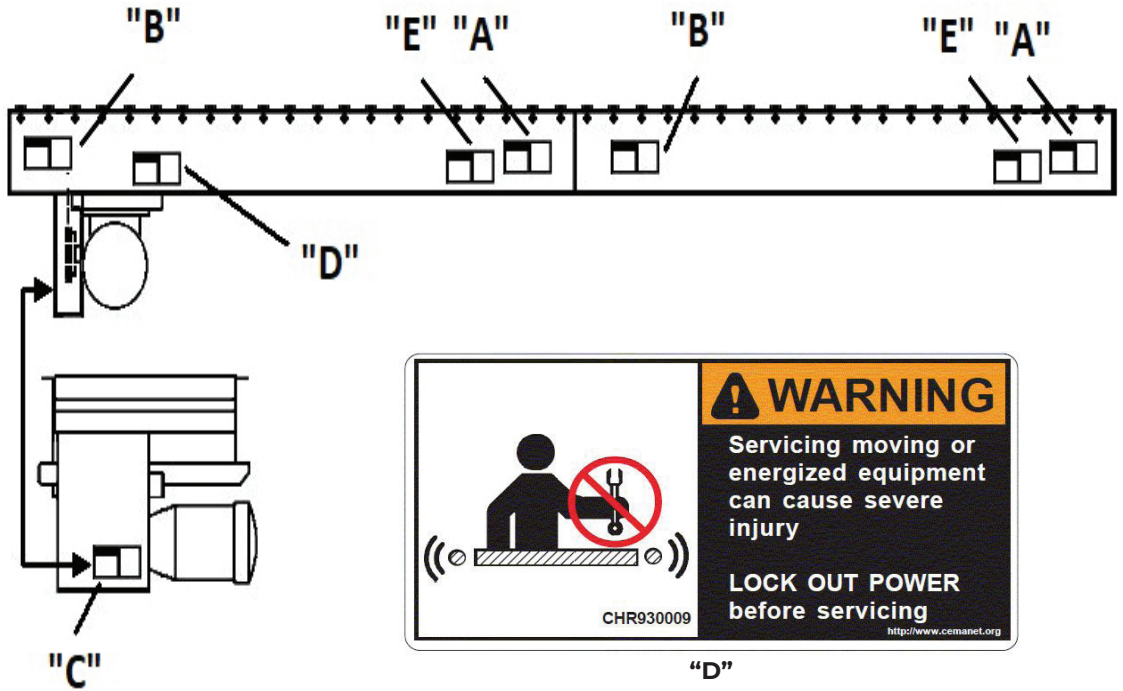
Caution, Warning, and Danger are words along with graphics used on these labels to help identify hazards. Examples of the labels are as follows:
